

**PHILIPPINE FISHERIES DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY  
ANNUAL ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT  
CY 2010**

Hereunder are the salient features of our Agency's Accomplishment for CY 2010  
(Refer to Attachments for details):

**I. ON THE OPERATION OF THE REGIONAL FISH PORT COMPLEXES**

Pursuant to its mandate, PFDA sustained the operation of eight (8) regional fish ports as follows:

**A. Navotas Fish Port Complex (NFPC)**

Total volume of fish unloadings was recorded at 131,937 metric tons (m.t.), a 11% increase from the 2009 record of 118,453 m.t.. Also, the port serviced a total of 14,362 fishing and non-fishing vessels.

As part of the NFPC's commitments to render better services to various clients, the following maintenance works were undertaken: declogging/repair of manhole cover; patching of roadways 30 l.m.; repair of gates and walls of markets 1 & 2; operation and maintenance of power and water facilities and replacement of defective light bulbs at all markets.

**B. Iloilo Fish Port Complex (IFPC)**

For CY 2010, total volume of fish unloadings at the IFPC was recorded at 30,038 m.t., 23% higher compared to last year's volume of 24,427 m.t. The port serviced a total of 1,366 fishing and non fishing vessels.

In addition, the following maintenance works were carried out: repair of water pump and revetment at quayside area.

**C. Zamboanga Fish Port Complex (ZFPC)**

Volume of fish unloadings during the year was posted at 8,113 m.t., a 33% decrease from last year's record of 12,113 m.t.. Ice production increased by 15% from 10,281 m.t. in 2009 to 11,862 m.t. in 2010.

A total of seven (7) processors utilized the port's processing and refrigeration facilities. Volume of marine products processed was registered at 822 m.t., 41% lower than last year's volume of 1,394 m.t..

D. Camaligan Fish Port Complex (CFPC)

A total of four (4) regular processors utilized the refrigeration facilities of the port and recorded a combined volume of 176 m.t., of processed marine products. Said volume is 4% higher than the 2009 output of 170 m.t.. On ice production, a total of 3,214 m.t., or 64,280 blocks was produced, 66% higher than last year's record of 1,935 m.t. or 38,700 blocks.

E. Lucena Fish Port Complex (LFPC)

Total volume of fish unloadings at the port was reported at 31,704 m.t., 33% higher than the 2009 record of 23,774 m.t.. Similarly, the total number of fishing and non-fishing vessels increased from 4,467 in 2009 to 6,950 in 2010. Ice production also increased by 5% from 6,388 m.t. to 6,738 m.t..

F. Sual Fish Port Complex (SFPC)

The port serviced a total of 1,122 fishing vessels and recorded total volume of fish unloadings at 801 m.t., a 25% increase from last year's figure of 639 m.t..

G. Davao Fish Port Complex (DFPC)

In CY 2010 the port serviced a total of 3,251 foreign and local fishing vessels. Volume of fish unloaded at the port increased by 16% from 3,693 m.t. in 2009 to 4,268 m.t. in 2010. On the otherhand, ice production decreased by 9% from 7,448 m.t. in 2009 to 6,781 m.t. in 2010.

A total of five (5) processors utilized the port's processing and refrigeration facilities. Volume of marine products processed (mostly tuna and abalone octopus and cuttlefish) was reported at 881 m.t., 24% lower than the 2009 volume of 1,152 m.t..

H. General Santos Fish Port Complex (GSFPC)

The port serviced a total of 8,825 fishing vessels (municipal and commercial fishing vessels). Total volume of fish unloading reached 143,140 m.t., a decrease of 0.1% from the 2009 volume of 143,316 m.t.. Ice production increased by 4% from 11,814 m.t. in 2009 to 12,341 m.t. in 2010.

Six (6) processors utilized the port's processing and refrigeration facilities producing 607 m.t.. This volume is 46% lower compared with the previous year's record of 1,133 m.t.. Among the major species processed were skip jack, yellow fin tuna and round scad.

## II. ON THE OPERATION OF MUNICIPAL FISH PORTS (MFP)

In line with its program to stimulate fisheries development at the municipal level, the PFDA, together with the concerned local government units, sustained the regular operation of the municipal fish port located in Infanta, Quezon. Volume of fish unloaded and transshipped in this port reached 4,188 m.t., an increase of 42% from the 2009 record of 2,947 m.t.. Similarly, the number of calls by municipal and commercial fishing vessels increased from 1,219 in 2009 to 1,637 in 2010.

To date, a total of seventy (70) MFPs have been turned-over to the concerned local government units for operation and management as follows:

### **III. ON THE OPERATION OF ICE PLANTS AND COLD STORAGE (IPCS)**

In support of the government privatization scheme, the PFDA leased out various ice plants and cold storages to the private sector.

To date, there are eight IPCS leased out nationwide located in the following areas:

### **IV. ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE POST-HARVEST AND OTHER INFRASTRUCTURE COMPONENT UNDER THE NATIONAL FISHERIES PROGRAM**

In line with the implementation of the fisheries infrastructure component, improvement projects were completed in the Regional Fish Port Complexes, as follows:

1. Zamboanga Fish Port Complex (ZFPC)
  - Repair of freshwater system and Rehabilitation of deep wells
2. Camaligan Fish Port Complex (CFPC)
  - Repair/Rewinding of the exciter, field coil and reconditioned starting system of Gen Set No. 2
3. General Santos Fish Port Complex (GSFPC)
  - Conversion of Left Side Processing Area into Cold Storage Room
4. Lucena Fish Port Complex (LFPC)
  - Improvement/Repair of existing facilities which include the replacement of damaged roofing of refrigeration bldg. and water supply (Package B)

Moreover, the repair of electrical system in Infanta MFP is for implementation and construction of additional thirteen (13) Municipal Fish Ports was completed in the following areas:

1. Brgy. Bancal, Carles, Iloilo
2. Brgy. Poblacion, South Oton, Iloilo
3. Brgy. Banicain, Olongapo, Zambales
4. Brgy. Poblacion, Daram, Samar

Also, Infrastructure Assessment/Validation/Appraisal Reports for the proposed construction of municipal fish ports and ice plant and cold storages in Dapa, Surigao del Norte; Maimbung, Sulu; and Polilio, Quezon were completed. On the other hand, Pre-Feasibility Study Reports on the proposed municipal fish ports and ice plant in Dingalan, Baler, and Casiguran, Aurora were completed.

The Detailed Engineering Study for the proposed rehabilitation/improvement of Sapián MFP in Brgy. Poblacion, Capiz was completed.

On the preparation of Master Plan for the Establishment of Fisheries Post-harvest Facilities, a total twenty eight (28) surveys were undertaken in the following areas:

- a. Palawan: Rizal, Quezon, Espanola, Bataraza, El Nido, Taytay, San Vicente, Roxas, Aborlan, Araceli, Dumarán and Narra;
- b. Mindoro Oriental: Calapan City, Puerto Galera, Victoria, Gloria, Pinamalayan, Bongabong, and Mansalay;
- c. Mindoro Occidental: Sablayan, Mamburao, Magsaysay, Paluan, Abra de Ilog, San Jose, Calintaan and Sta. Cruz.

Preparation of Assessment Reports for the above mentioned sites are on-going.

## **V. ON THE NATIONWIDE FISH PORTS PROJECT (PACKAGE III)**

The proposed project entails the rehabilitation/improvement of existing regional fish ports and establishment of satellite municipal fish ports. The Feasibility Study for the proposed project including the conduct of Environmental Study, Hydro-graphic Surveys and Soil Investigation Study has been completed. The Final Report was submitted by Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) last November 2010. On-going is the preparation of Project Proposal for the implementation of the project which will be submitted to NEDA-ICC for its evaluation and approval.
