RE: AUTHORIZATION TO GRANT FY2014 PBB AND FY2015 PEI TO ELIGIBLE OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES

Dear Secretary Alcala and OIC Datahan,

The PHILIPPINE FISHERIES DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (PFDA) has satisfied the requirements of GCG MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR (MC) No. 2014-05 (Re-Issued) and the Checklist of Documents to be submitted by GOCCs to Qualify for the FY 2014 Performance-Based Bonus (PBB). This is based on:

- 1. Certifications executed under oath by the Chairman, General Manager, and other concerned officers of the PFDA;
- 2. Review by the GCG of the completeness of required submissions from PFDA for FY 2014 PBB, including compliance with Good Governance Conditions specific to the GOCC Sector;
- 3. Validation by the GCG of the accomplishments of PFDA for FY 2014 as of 28 May 2015 with a Performance Scorecard rating of 91.30% (*Annex A*); and
- Validations received from the Civil Service Commission (CSC), PhilGEPS, the Department of Budget and Management (DBM), and the A.O. No. 25 Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) Secretariat, pursuant to the directive by the A.O. No. 25 IATF.

Accordingly, the Governing Board of PFDA is hereby <u>AUTHORIZED</u> to grant the PBB FY 2014, with a grand total of <u>P14,297,957.05</u>, to 610 eligible officers and employees as follows:

However, the Governing Board of PFDA shall ensure that the PBBs will only be released to officers and employees who have complied and submitted their Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Net Worth (SALN).

We respectfully remind the Governing Board to ensure that PFDA's grant of the FY 2014 PBB should observe the following conditions:

- The funding to support the PBB shall be charged by PFDA to its corporate funds, subject to GCG MC No. 2014-05 (Re-Issued);
- The total cost of the PBB shall not result in a net loss for CY 2014 computed in accordance to the formula for profitability under GCG MC No. 2014-05 (Re-Issued);
- 3. In the event that the total amount of PBB to be distributed exceeds the Corporate Operating Budget (COB) level, the Governing Board shall request from DBM the approval of the Supplemental Budget necessary for this purpose;

- 4. No other performance-based bonus or its equivalent has been released or will be released for FY 2014 in addition to the PBB scheme provided under GCG MC No. 2014-05 (Re-Issued); and
- 5. PFDA shall officially agree with the Department of Finance (DOF), devise a plan/timetable/payment scheme on its pending request for (i) recomputation with the assistance of Commission on Audit (COA), of dividends in arrears for CY 2005-2013 set by DOF at ₱76.73 Million (of which ₱37.2 Million was paid by the PFDA); and (ii) waiving of interest payable and earmarking 5% of PFDA's net income annually, to pay for the ₱1,013.56 Million NG advances demanded by the DOF.¹ Any developments or official communications on the matter shall be reported and copy furnished to the Governance Commission.

This is a one-time approval applicable only for FY 2014.

Moreover, for having met the conditions provided under Section 4 of E.O. No. 181, s. 2015,² the PFDA is hereby <u>AUTHORIZED</u> to grant the 2015 Productivity Enhancement Incentive (PEI) equivalent to one (1) month basic salary, or at a lower rate in case of insufficient funds, to its officers and employees who have qualified under Section 6 of E.O. No. 181 on the Employee Service Requirement. Payment of the PEI shall be made not earlier than 01 June 2015.
